Background

World Environment Day (WED), commemorated each year on 5 June, was identified by the United Nations General Assembly in 1972 to raise environmental awareness and to encourage action to protect the environment. This year Ministry of Environment, Forests, and Climate Change (MoEFCC), Government of India has taken a lead role to celebrate World Environment Day through multiple functions, events and campaigns. The theme for 2018 is “Plastic Pollution”.

Objective

Under the major Government scheme Environmental Information System (ENVIS), implemented by MoEFCC, The Energy & Resources Institute (TERI) and Centre for Media Studies (CMS), which are also ENVIS Resource Partners (RPs), propose to sensitize a select population of school students in Delhi and NCR about the menace of plastic pollution. We intend to organize this programme as part of larger WED celebration planned by the MoEFCC at Vigyan Bhawan during 1-5 June 2018.

Programme Methodology

The WED celebration programme will have a mixture of field activities which will culminate into conduction of a special event during 1-5 June 2018. Proposed activities will consist of EnviroQuiz and Poster making and Slogan contests among the schools in and around Delhi. Both TERI and CMS teams will be visiting schools for conducting the preliminary round of the Quiz and poster making and slogan contents. The proposed programmes will ensure involvement of school children from approx. 150 schools studying in Class 7-9 levels (one student from each level for each activity). Approx. 25-30 schools in Delhi and NCR would be selected on first cum first basis and also on merit. Around 8-16 schools will be shortlisted for final round of Quiz on the Environment Day celebration day. The schools and students will be awarded certificates and prizes on winning and participation in the contests.
